I want to extend a very warm, and enthusiastic welcome to everyone - come join the Celebration Choir! No experience is necessary. We're all learning together and it's always about progress, not perfection, as we serve our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ through musical worship. Our first rehearsal is Thursday, September 7, from 7-8 p.m. with our first choir performance on Rally Sunday, September 10.

"Respecting the old while embracing the 21st century." Currently, we have one "blended" service per week to serve the needs of our congregation. At present it is approximately 75-80% traditional/20-25% contemporary music. We continue to welcome young people, and young families to First Lutheran - the future lifeblood of the church. Our Evangelism committee and community outreach are working diligently to welcome a diverse membership. Last year we began the tradition of a musical celebration of Black History Month, and we continue to explore African American Spirituals and African songs from our hymnal, as well as choir compositions by African American composers. This year we will begin a more active exploration of songs in our hymnal including Hispanic and other cultures.

We perform the first three Sundays of the month and holidays, with two in front and one in the loft per month, subject to change based on congregation needs. We rehearse before the Sunday services that we perform at 8:30 a.m. and on Thursdays from 7-8 p.m.
